




## **The Swedish Council for Higher Education**

Government Agency with 330 staff responsible for:

- Recognising foreign qualifications Sweden's ENIC-NARIC with 85 staff proficient in over 30 languages. National Coordinator for Professional Qualifications Directive and related assessment.
- Coordinating admission to HE and the HE entry test.
- Developing and managing *e-services* for the education sector.
- Internationalisation across the entire education spectrum.
- Cooperation with other government partners on integration, validation &






#### **Recognition and assessment as part of a validation process**

"Validation is a process of a structured assessment, valuing, documentation and recognition of knowledge and competences that an individual has gained, irrespective of how they have been acquired"

- (Government definition DS 2003:23)




## Validation process



#### **ENIC-NARIC Sweden**

- The Department of Qualifications Recognition at UHR is Sweden's ENIC-NARIC office.
- As such, one of our tasks is to inform higher education institutions and other stakeholders about qualifications recognition and which organisation to approach if you wish to work in a regulated profession.
- The European Union and the Council of Europe have, in partnership with UNESCO, established two networks: NARIC (National Academic Recognition Information Centre) within the EU and ENIC (European Network of Information Centres) within UNESCO.






## **The Lisbon Recognition Convention**

Countries that have ratified the Lisbon Recognition Convention shall:

- recognise each other's qualifications for
  - access to education
  - credit transfers for periods of study
  - admission to continued education
- recognise each other's qualifications in order do make it easier for people to find work in a country other than the one in which they were educated.

*The EAR Manual* is a European manual for the recognition of qualifications.





## **Recognition and evaluation of foreign Qualifications**

We evaluate foreign:

- -Academic education
- -Post-secondary vocational education
- -Upper secondary education

We recognise foreign education that has been completed with a degree or final school grades.

The school or higher education institution that issued the qualification must be recognised/accredited by the country in which it is based.

#### The recognition statement

- Digital since March 2019. Digital original paper document always a printout.
- Our recognition statement shows the **equivalent** to a foreign qualification in the Swedish educational system.
- The purpose of the recognition statement is to provide support for people looking for work in Sweden, and for people who wish to continue studying in Sweden.
- All applicants also receive a cover letter including further information regarding the education and its purposes.
- The statement also contains general information about the Swedish education system.
- Verify authenticity with UHR.






## **Background paper**


- No documents? Apply for a background paper instead of a recognition statement.
- Higher education (academic or post-secondary vocational education).
- A background paper describes your educational background and is an alternative when missing educational documents.







## **Qualifications Assessment Tool**

- General comparison of foreign and Swedish education to download and print out.
- In both Swedish and English.
- 66 countries and up to 700 qualifications.
- Addition to an individual assessment.
- Use when applying for work in Sweden and for students who plan to study abroad.








## NARIC-portal for recognition of foreign education

- The information is primarily focused on higher education.






#### Number of applications 2013-2020


## Syria 2013-2020

## **The Professional Qualifications Directive**

- The recognition of professional qualifications (Directive 2005/36/EC) enables and promotes the free movement of professionals in regulated professions within Europe.
- A process for recognition, combined with a European Professional Card (EPC), was implemented in January 2016. The EPC is an electronic certificate and an advantageous option for professionals who wish to work either temporarily or permanently in another EU country.
- UHR is the national authority and co-ordinator for the competent authorities in Sweden and also Sweden's national assistance centre for the Professional Qualifications Directive (PQD).





#### **Regulated professions**

- Regulated profession The law defines the skills and competences necessary for permission to work. A profession is regulated by a specific certificate/ID, educational degree or authorisation, for example.
- A competent authority is responsible for administrative checks and recognition of qualifications. There are 15 competent authorities in Sweden and about 50 professions are regulated. That is quite low, compared to other European countries.
- Teacher profession, largest group with 1500-2000 assessments per year.





# Linking recognition to broader strategic goals such as labour market needs and integration of immigrants

- Sweden views credential evaluation and recognition as broad public services linked to national needs and challenges.
- Traditionally, our work focuses on certifying authenticity, accreditation and documentation. Transcripts and diplomas provide the information we to need recognise completed education and compare with Swedish qualifications, *but our goal is to further develop our recognition statements so that we provide more information on the learning outcomes associated with the education and training.*
- Employers express the need for more information on assessed education and qualifications. Our recognition statements are viewed as useful (certificates of authenticity) but lack information about learning outcomes.



## Benefits of moving to a LO approach (and SeQF) in Sweden

- A substantial part of learning occurs outside the formal education system (e.g. sectors, training at work, liberal adult education, labour market training). Including qualifications awarded outside the formal education system and bringing qualifications together in a national framework increases transparency and transferability. It also:
- Facilitates for individuals, employers and education providers to evaluate levels.
- Increases LM mobility and facilitate matching.
- Facilitates validation and legitimise validation on the LM.
- Increases interest among actors to work with LO and QA (we see this with applications for a level placement in the SeQF).
- Stimulates lifelong learning.
