
The National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ)

The NFQ:

- A system of ten levels for classifying qualifications in Ireland
- Promotes the use of learning outcomes to represent and recognise learning achievements
- Defines the relationship between qualifications and supports pathways within further education and employment opportunities
- Promotes public confidence in the quality of qualifications offered and achieved in Ireland
- Facilitates academic recognition of qualifications
- A policy instrument for lifelong learning

The Irish NFQ





CLASSES OF AWARD



Major Awards: named in the outer rings, are the principal class of awards made at a level



Minor Awards: are for partial completion of the outcomes for a Major Award



Supplemental Awards: are for learning that is additional to a Major Award



Special Purpose Awards: are for relatively narrow or purpose-specific achievement.

Professional Awards: these are for occupation-orientated qualifications including apprenticeships







Institutional Arrangements for NFQ Development

> 1999 Qualifications Act established the National Qualifications Authority of Ireland

The objects of the Authority shall be as follows:

- (a) to establish and maintain a framework, being a framework for the development, recognition and award of qualifications in the State (in this Act referred to as a "framework of qualifications"), based on standards of knowledge, skill or competence to be acquired by learners;
- (b) to establish and promote the maintenance and improvement of the standards of further education and training awards and higher education and training awards of the Further Education and Training Awards Council, the Higher Education and Training Awards Council, the Dublin Institute of Technology and universities established under section 9 of the Act of 1997; and
- (c) to promote and facilitate access, transfer and progression

National Qualifications Authority of Ireland 2001-2012)

- Statutory body
- Representative Board 14 Members
- Obliged to consult on policy formation
- Focus on development work
- > Staff c27, annual govt budget c.4m€.
- Organisational Structure NFQ Development and Implementation; Qualifications Recognition; Corporate.

Quality and Qualifications Ireland 2012-2021

- QQI Established under the Qualifications and Quality Assurance Act 2012
- ➤ Functions to administer external quality assurance for post school Education and training system in Ireland
- > To further develop, implement and review the National Framework of Qualifications
- > To promote the international recognition of Irish qualifications and the recognition of international qualifications in Ireland
- QQI Strategy 2019-2021 Mission, Values, Priorities, Indicators

Quality and Qualifications Ireland 2012-2021

- Non-Representative Board of 10 Members, except for learner and international representatives
- Accountable to Government
- > Has an 'advisory' function to Ministers
- 'Subject to this Act, the Authority shall be independent in the performance of its functions'
- ➤ Annual Budget c11m€ (50/50 exchequer and fees)
- Specific NFQ governance arrangements evolving
- > European Level Governance?
