






Benefits of the IGADQF

- Promoting dialogue and mutual understanding within the education and training sectors:
- ii. Creating a wider pool of knowledge, skills, values and competencies in the region as countries begin to collaborate and share information on their training and educational organization and outcomes;
- iii. Creating of national databases of qualifications awarded within the region, so it will be easier to estimate demand and supply of qualifications to meet labour market needs;
- v. Better quality of qualifications as all countries will be required to produce qualifications to similar standards;
- Allowing learners, workers, refugees and returnees greater flexibility and mobility within the region and increasing the pool of learning opportunities;
- vi. Facilitating determination of qualification comparability and credit transfers in the IGAD region;
- vii. Promoting cross border recognition and portability of skills, knowledge and competences; and
- viii. Promoting greater co-operation and unity of purpose between IGAD Member countries and especially among education and training stakeholders;



Governance Principles


- No country is left behind: All IGAD member countries are invited to participate in the activities on equal footing;
- ii. IGADQF activities will include referencing to the IGADQF, peer reviews, deliberations in the context of the governing structure, capacity-development programmes, dissemination and outreach, and collaboration on the IGADQF Qualifications Platform (database);
- iii. The IGAD provides political support and steering and participates in the IGADQF governing structure;
- Technical implementation is assured by a competent unit responsible for IGADQF functions and operations; based at the IGAD secretariat;
- v. Networking and collaboration between IGAD member national qualifications entities, social partners, professional associations, recognition centres, students' unions, and other relevant stakeholders;
- vi. Governance and management are based on accountability and integrity; and vii. The IGADQF process is supported by monitoring and evaluation.
