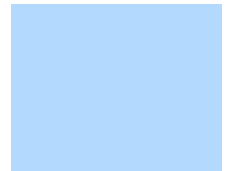

Reforms and Establishment of KNQF :-

- Harmonize the fragmented qualifications awarding system for fair articulation, classification, registration, quality assurance of qualifications.
- Ensure that Kenyan qualifications meet national and internationally acceptable standards.
- Clarify progression pathways and enable seamless progression, mobility and transferability of learners' skills and qualifications.
- Develop national tools to facilitate Lifelong learning.



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Building Blocks for Learner Mobility & Progression

1. Qualifications levels.
2. Levels descriptors/ ELOs).
3. Articulation and exit pathways.
4. Credit Accumulation and Transfer System.
5. Recognition of Prior Learning

Section 8(1)(L) of the KNQF Act, mandates KNQA to facilitate linkages, credit transfers and exemptions and a vertical and horizontal mobility at all levels to enable entry, re-entry and exit.

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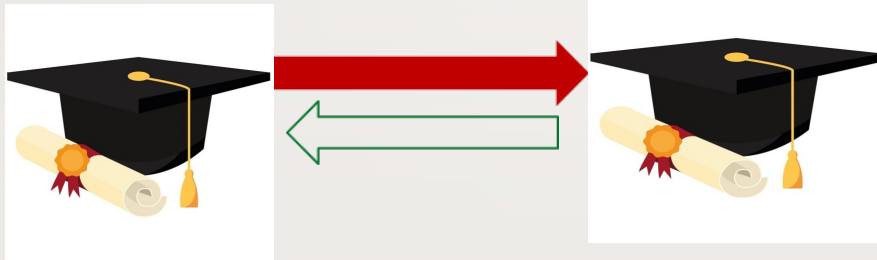
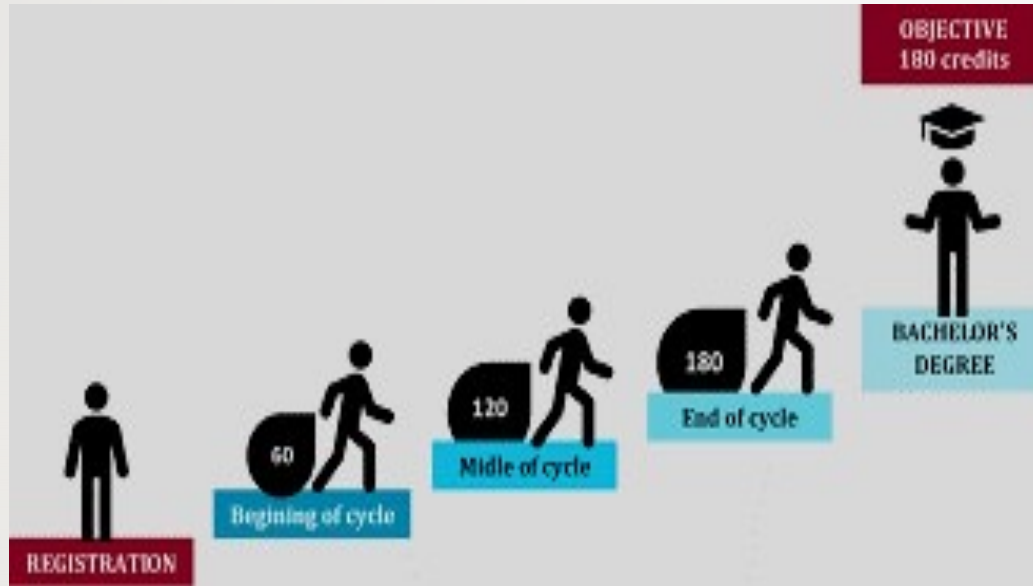
CREDIT ACCUMULATION AND TRANSFER (CAT)

- ❑ A systematic way of describing an educational program or qualification by **attaching credits** to its components

It entails:-

- ❑ **Accumulation of Credits - Totaling** of relevant credits towards a qualification
- ❑ **Transfer of credits :- Vertical, horizontal or diagonal** relocation of related/similar credits
- ❑ It allows credit awarded to a learner to be **recognized**, quantified, and included towards the credit requirements of another related programme/qualifications.

Credit Accumulation and Transfer Cont...



Used to validate and recognize formal learning

Enabler of free movement of persons, skills, qualifications = Mobility & LLL

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Kenya Credit Accumulation and Transfer System

Goal-To provide a comprehensive and integrated national framework to facilitate validation and recognition of formal prior learning to support mobility

Objectives:-

- a) Development of credible, efficient, and transparent processes for credit accumulation and transfer across different qualification levels, programmes, and sub-sectors in education and training;
- b) Institutionalizing the KCATS into organizational policies and procedures;
- c) Facilitating learner and skills mobility and progression;
- d) Promoting lifelong learning; and
- e) Strengthen quality assurance of KCATS process nationally.

PURPOSE OF THE KCAT SYSTEM



KCATS is designed to:

- Monitor, record and maintain** student achievement & progress through modular certificate, Diploma and Degree courses.
- Facilitate recognition, comparability and transferability of periods of study thus enhances student mobility.
- Facilitate progression:- entry, re-entry and exit between and within QF levels, courses and institutions.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES AND BENEFITS OF KCATS

A coordinated and harmonized CATs system through integration with existing policies and legal frameworks for education, training

02

Common currency of exchange of knowledge, skills and competences leading to free movement of people (AfCFTA)

03

Well-developed CATS implementation plan, quality assurance, assessment system, monitoring and evaluation system;

04

Creating a single integrated national roadmap/ framework to guide learner progression

05

Enhanced collaborations, linkages and partnerships among the CATs stakeholders through clear definition of their respective roles;

increased student mobility between pathways, world of work and LLL

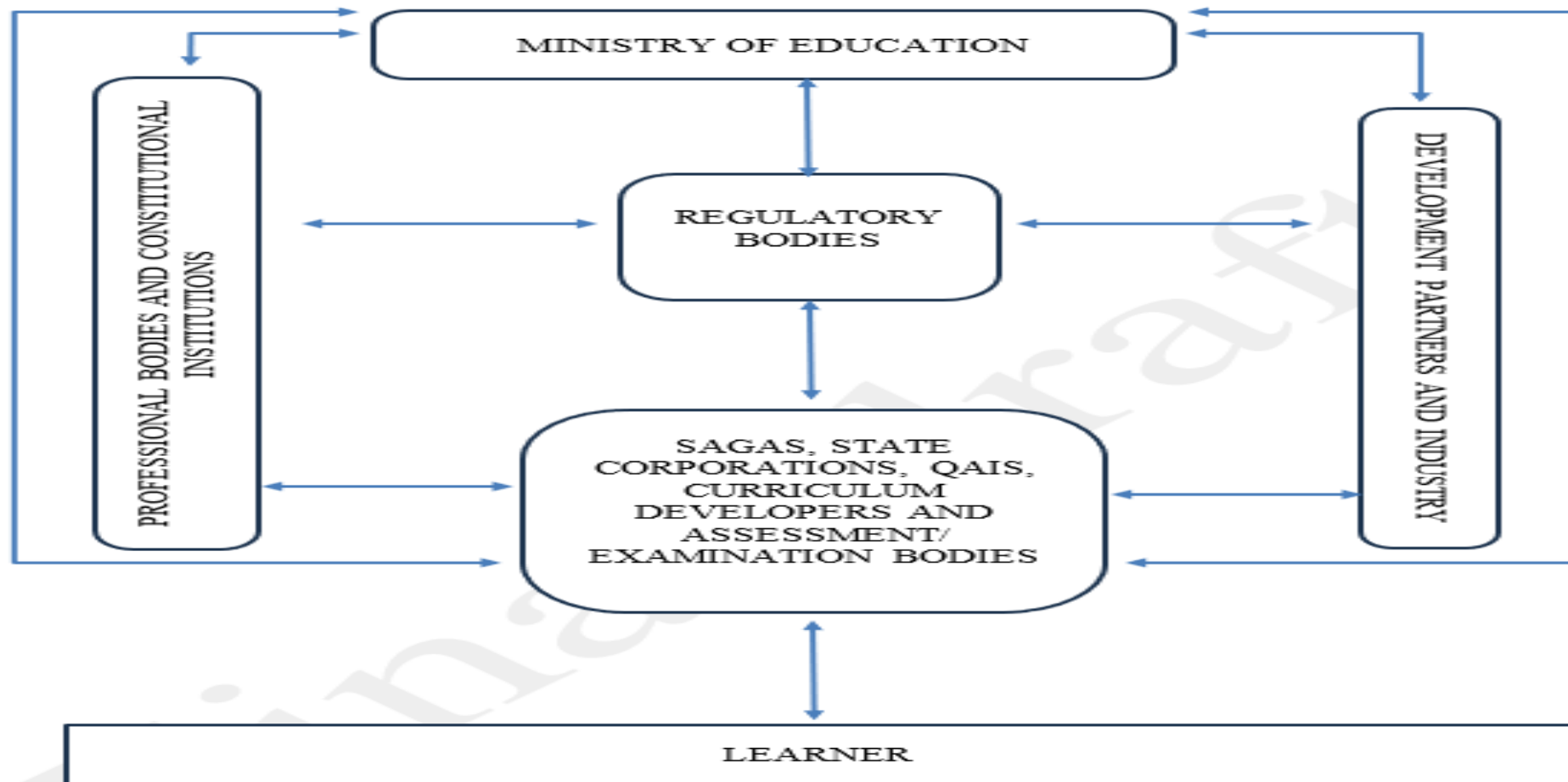


Fig 1: KCATS Implementation Structure
