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Country presentations

Overview of developments

Eight MS presented – the following is a summary:

- MS are at different stages of NQF development and implementation
- Some are at conception stage: discussion of legal framework establishment of governance structure and the framework as well e.g. DRC
- Moz. had their legal framework recently sanctioned. They have TVET QF and the aim is to develop a comprehensive NQF
- Most QF governance bodies are under Ministries of Education
- MS have ten–level NQFs, three sub-frameworks
- Most MS are in the process of reviewing their NQFs, some even the legal and policy instruments

Country presentations

Overview of developments

- MS are working aggressively towards ratifying the Addis Convention
- MS continue to conduct capacity building for institutions on new approach (learning outcomes)
- RPL guidelines available in some MS and in process of being developed in others

Challenges

- Articulation within and across sub frameworks
- Understanding learning outcomes and application
- Inertia adoption of outcomes approach and QA for public institutions –old institutions
- Coordinating three sub-frameworks (councils) managed under different ministries
- Embracing micro-credentials

EQF

- EQF governed through the EQF Advisory Group composed of rep from Member States
- 87% of Members States EQF level on certificates, diplomas
- 92% referenced to EQF

Cooperation of NQFs and SADC QF

SADC IT competency framework for teachers

- Alignment vs Referencing
- Consideration to streamline the alignment criteria make it more robust
- Possible platforms to facilitate information sharing address topical questions
- Framework developed, to be presented during the meeting of the Ministers of Education, Training Science and Technology in June
- Overview of framework presented and appreciated by meeting
- Concerns included:
 - students are more digitally competent than teachers
 - challenges of IT in teaching e.g. students' assessments
 - Access- IT Infrastructure
