1. Context

The government of Sierra Leone and the key stakeholders are determined to develop a contextualized and effective National Qualifications Framework (NQF), comprehensive and inclusive of all levels and types of qualifications and able to deliver on the objectives of quality, transparency and portability of skills and qualifications for lifelong learning, employability, social justice, and contributing to the green and digital transformation. The NQF development process, carried by parallel projects in Higher education and in TVET, has now reached a fundamental crossroad, when all institutions and partners are ready to take stock of the existing foundations, rethink the way forward and take the required steps to agree the scope, principles, structure, and governance of this important policy instrument.

The national institutions agree to the importance of capacity development on NQF-related content, seen as an indispensable premise for national ownership and leadership of the NQF development process. This new phase builds on the lessons learned from the first NQF reflection phase, on the African experiences shared in the ACQF context, and the new national debate around the revised roadmap for the NQF Technical Commission.

Representatives of NCTVA have continuously participated in the webinars, conferences, and training workshops of the ACQF project since July 2020. Cooperation and exchanges with ACQF were reinforced from the ACQF-Training Week in September 2020 in Johannesburg. The participation of Sierra Leone at the Addis Conference which validated the ACQF Policy Document shed light on the NQF development process in Sierra Leone, with a presentation by NCTVA for a wide audience of representatives from 33 African countries and the leadership of the African Union Commission (Education). More recently, Sierra Leone participated in the 1st Training Workshop of the ACQF-II, in Nairobi (9-11/Oct), with two delegates representing the Ministry of Higher Education and Technical Education and NCTVA. This cooperation laid the foundations for mutual trust and a contextualized work plan for the period until end 2026, encompassing aspects of development of the comprehensive

and inclusive NQF, and of other related policies and instruments such as RPL, Credit Accumulation and Transfer System and Register / database of qualifications.

This organisation of this Capacity Development Programme with a country-specific focus and objectives is a result of this growing collaboration. ACQF-II project contributes with the expertise, (trainers and experts), the knowledge base (ACQF Training Modules, Technical Notes and Thematic Briefs) and the networking possibilities with other countries and institutions. Sierra Leone organises the two workshops according to national orientations and with support of the World Bank. This combination of resources for a common objective is a token of mutual trust between ACQF-II and the national NQF institutions and stakeholders.

2. Capacity development program 2023-2024

The combination of themes on the agenda of the program reflects the preliminary exchanges of ACQF-II coordination with the Ministry of Technical and Higher Education and the NCTVA. The themes are proposed in the technical note "Draft SLNQF Stages and Activities", shared in October 2023 by NCTVA.

Main features of the SLNQF Capacity Development Program

1. Objectives and outcomes

- a. Introduction and deepening on the concepts, implementation methods and instruments and practices related to NQF in a systemic view. The themes of this Program are listed below.
- b. Application and debate: brainstorming and strategic reflection on the NQF for Sierra Leone.
- c. The agenda combines key thematic presentations with discussion, practical exercises, and contextualised application. Participation certificates will be awarded to participants who complete the program.

5. Themes and issues on the agenda

Part I (27 Nov - 01 Dec 2023)

Focus: NQF - rationale, goals, operations, governance, main instruments

Day 1: NQF – from A to Z: concepts, goals, principles, types, trends, examples. ACQF – a meta-framework. *Brainstorming*.

Day 2: NQF structures. Focus on learning outcomes and level descriptors. Uses in the context of qualifications development and renewal. *Self-assessment on state of play*.

Day 3: Registration and classification of qualifications. Classifications: ESCO, ISCED, ISCO-08. *Practical exercise*.

Day 4: NQF governance (I): models, legislation, institutions, stakeholders involvement. Quality Assurance of qualifications and of the NQF. *Debate*.

Day 5: NQF governance (II): monitoring and evaluation. Labour market intelligence for relevant qualifications. *Brainstorming*. *Final learners'* assessment.

Part II (Quarter I 2024)

Focus: NQF and related policies

Day 1: Assessment of learning outcomes. Certification. Recognition of prior learning – from A to Z: concepts, goals, principles, types, trends, examples. Simulation. *Self-assessment on state of play*.

Day 2: Credit accumulation and transfer systems. Concepts, principles, uses. Examples from Africa, Europe, and the US. Practical application. Simulation. *Self-assessment on state of play*

Day 3: Qualifications: types, development, implementation, renewal. Adaptation to new demands from labour market, and society. Articulation – types, measures, examples.

Day 4: Digitalisation in the context of education and qualifications. Micro-credentials – a new player. Green and digital skills and the role of NQF. *Debate*.

Day 5: ACQF: referencing. ACQF Database of qualifications – national and continental layers, interoperability. ACQF common profiles of qualifications. *Brainstorming. Final assessment.*
